**City Government Structure:** The City of Kingsburg incorporated in 1908 as a Charter City, with a Council-Manager form of government.


**Council Structure:** The City Council of Kingsburg is composed of five Council Members who serve four (4) year terms. In 2018 the City transitioned in to districts. In 2020, the City will hold elections for Council seats representing Districts 2 & 3. The position of Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem are chosen by the Council after the General Municipal Election.

## CANDIDATE INFORMATION

Kingsburg will conduct a General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. The Election is held on the same day as the statewide General Election. There are two (2) elected positions within the City that are open for nominations:

- 🐾 Council Member - District 2
- 🐾 Council Member - District 3

## CANDIDATE FILING PERIOD

The filing period for a candidate for the November 3, 2020 election begins on Monday July 13, 2020 and ends on Friday August 7, 2020. If an incumbent does not file by August 7, the filing period shall be extended for that office to 5:00 p.m. on August 12, 2020 for candidates other than the incumbent.

A Candidate's Handbook, including an Official Nomination Paper, Candidate's Statement Form, Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Form 700 and Campaign Disclosure Forms, and other information concerning the November 3, 2020 City of Kingsburg General Municipal Election will be available by appointment at the City Clerk's Office beginning July 13, 2020.

## QUALIFICATIONS

Council Candidates must be residents and registered voters of the District they are seeking to represent at the time nomination papers are issued. Signatures on candidate nomination forms must be from registered voters in your District.

## FEES

Candidates wishing to have a Candidate's Statement printed in the sample ballot are required to pay an additional fee, which will be determined by the Fresno County Clerk's Office. There is a mandatory \$350 deposit.

## CAMPAIGN SIGN INFORMATION

The California Department of Transportation ("DOT") prohibits political signs from being placed in locations within the public right-of-way or be seen within 660 feet from the edge of the right-of-way for a designated "Landscaped Freeway." The DOT also specifies that signs may not be in place more than 90 days (August 10th) before or 10 days after the relevant election (November 13, 2020).

## CAMPAIGN FINANCE INFORMATION

Council Candidates must file FPPC Form 501 before you solicit or receive any contributions or before you make expenditures from personal funds on behalf of your candidacy.

## SALARY FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS

Council Members receive a salary of \$250/month. The Mayor receives \$300/month.

## COUNCIL MEETINGS

The City Council meets the first and third Wednesdays of each month - Regular Session begins at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at 1401 Draper Street, Kingsburg, CA 93631. The Council follows a regular order of business, as provided by the agenda for each meeting. The agenda packet is available for public inspection at the City Clerk's counter at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. ## OTHER COUNCIL RESPONSIBILITIES

Each Council Member sits on or serves as a liaison on additional commission, boards and committees. In total there are 15 commissions/committees and all Council Members share the responsibilities of attending additional meetings. Annually, Council will review the appointments and will make adjustments as needed.

All Council Members must comply with the Brown Act, Public Record Requests and the Conflict of Interest Code.
